

(Verbal resignation)

I wanted to let you know that I have <u>accepted an offer</u> to go to work with another firm and this is my formal two weeks notice.

While I have thoroughly enjoyed working here and this is no reflection upon you, the company or the great opportunities you've afforded me; this is simply a tremendous opportunity that I could not afford to pass up.

I have thought about this a great deal, this is a decision I haven't come to lightly and <u>I know you'll respect my decision on this matter.</u>

I do want to thank you for the opportunities that have been extended to me while I have been here. **If there is anything I can do in the next 2 weeks before leaving** to assist with the transition to my replacement please let me know. I want to make sure things go as smoothly as possible

Thank you for past consideration.

This verbal resignation can be changed to suit your personal style however, the 2 key phases are underlined and in bold. These are the keys to reducing the odds the company believes you are seeking a counter offer. The advantage is simple and obvious.

- If you aren't seeking a counter the last thing you need is the stress associated with your company aggressively trying to "talk you into" staying and playing on your loyalty, guilt and/or emotion.
- If you are interested to see what offer they would make as a counter you should approach
 them long before you begin interviewing. Only when they "have nothing to lose" will they
 give you a somewhat accurate gauge of where you really stand. Waiting until you resign is
 like holding a gun to your head. Ultimatums are never accurate forums for this type of
 analysis.
